

## When to use Lexis® Advance

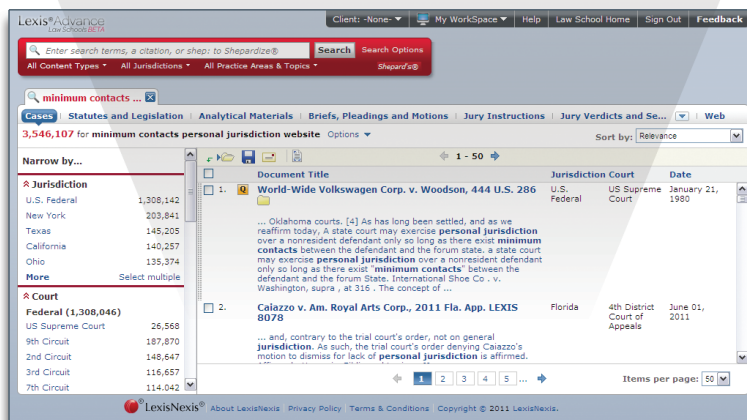
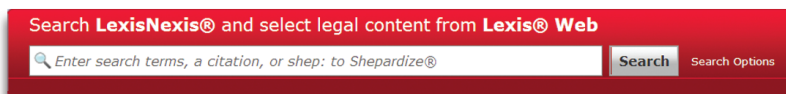
Stay focused on your legal issue while reviewing the most relevant sources.  
Use Lexis Advance when:

- You need **to conduct a comprehensive search** across all available sources\*
- You need **to quickly narrow your results** to the most relevant sources
- You need **to save your research and keep it organized** for quick retrieval

### Step 1 Conduct Comprehensive Research

Lexis Advance searches all the sources available providing a comprehensive set of results for your legal issue.



### Step 2 Quickly Find the Most Relevant Results

Get to the most relevant results quickly with content tabs and filters that let you sort by source, jurisdiction, date, etc...

### Step 3 Ensure Your Research is "Good Law" with Shepard's®

The same accurate and comprehensive content you rely upon in Shepard's is available on Lexis Advance. A new layout organizes citing references with tabs and filters, making it easy to see the most important analysis.

New to Lexis Advance are work folders which make it easy and convenient to save and organize your research.

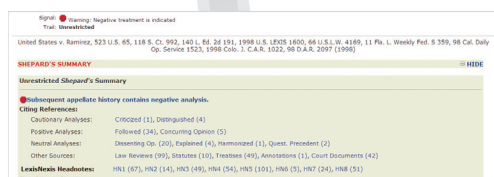
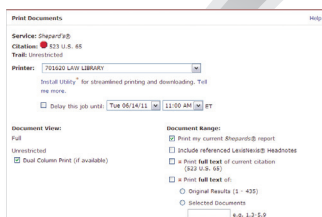
# When to use *lexis.com*®

- You want to print to a LexisNexis dedicated printer

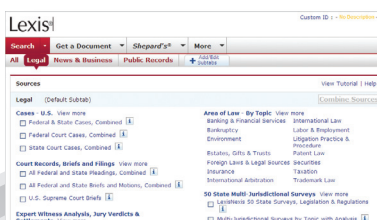
## Step 6 Print Your Results to a LexisNexis Printer

You can print any document you retrieve on *lexis.com* directly to the LexisNexis dedicated printer at your school. This feature is being developed for Lexis Advance as well.



## Step 5 Ensure Your Research is "Good Law" with Shepard's

Shepard's is still available on *lexis.com* with all the same information as Lexis® Advance. The main difference is the older, more linear report format on *lexis.com*.



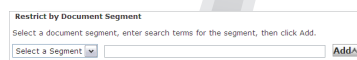
## Step 1 Select a Source to Search (repeat for each needed source)

You begin research on *lexis.com* by selecting your source. You can select a specific source and, in some cases, combine sources to search.



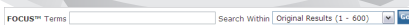
## Step 2 Select Natural Language or Terms & Connectors

Next you can choose to search the source you selected using either Natural Language or Terms & Connectors.



## Step 3 Enter Your Search Request

Segments are available when conducting a Terms & Connectors search on *lexis.com*. Use segments to search a specific part of a document (e.g., Headline, Title or Party Names).



## Step 4 FOCUS™ Your Results to the Most Relevant

Once you have your search results you can use FOCUS to further search through those results to find the most relevant documents based on any additional terms you have.
