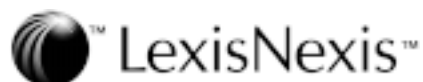

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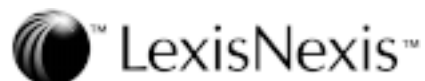
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# SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This series of Branch Department files is composed of five subseries: Newsletters, Annual Reports, Annual Activities Reports, General Office Files, and Staff files of Branch Director Gloster B. Current. The files primarily span from 1966 to 1972; however, four of the subseries have some items dated from before 1966. These materials were received by the Library of Congress in related accessions and have been arranged in one group by the Library of Congress.

The first subseries consists of newsletters from NAACP branches, state conferences, and regional offices. These newsletters are arranged by year and then in alphabetical order by state. The newsletters allow for a detailed view of the main issues, concerns, and campaigns of NAACP branches during the period between 1966 and 1972. They show NAACP branches grappling with the concept of Black Power, which gained national attention after Stokely Carmichael used the phrase at a rally in June 1966 in Greenwood, Mississippi. A column in the South Shore, Massachusetts, newsletter notes that “the NAACP pledges itself to support actively the aims of Black Power, which we understand to mean educational, political, and economic equality” (Reel 1, Frame 0155). In Davenport, Iowa, youth members formed the Davenport Black Power youth council. Meanwhile, in California, members of the Palo Alto–Stanford branch affiliated with the National Committee to Revitalize the NAACP, also known as the “Young Turks.” The Young Turks originally came into being in 1962 because they feared that the NAACP would be left behind by more radical organizations like the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee. By the late 1960s, the Young Turks disagreed with the NAACP’s official position on Black Power. The Greenwich Village–Chelsea, New York, newsletter for April 1970 includes excerpts from a speech by New York NAACP State Conference President Donald R. Lee discussing African American control of economic, political, and educational institutions. Other newsletters contain articles on the assassination of Black Panther Party leaders by law enforcement officials, the riot at New York’s Attica Correctional Facility, and the NAACP’s position with regard to the 1972 National Black Political Convention in Gary, Indiana.

During the period covered by these newsletters, the NAACP also continued to work toward its traditional goal of ending discrimination in all aspects of American life. School desegregation and quality education for African Americans continued to be a major focus of the NAACP after 1965. By the early 1970s, busing to achieve school desegregation emerged as a significant national issue, and school desegregation and school busing are covered in many newsletters. For example, the Detroit, Michigan, branch newsletters contain regular reports on the Detroit school

desegregation case that became *Milliken v. Bradley*, a pivotal case in the history of school desegregation. Other topics covered in the newsletters include voter registration, the War on Poverty, urban riots, and the civil rights policies of the Nixon administration. The newsletters begin at Frame 0001 of Reel 1 and continue through to Frame 0448 of Reel 4. Additional newsletters for the period from 1966 to 1971 can also be found in UPA's *Papers of the NAACP, Part 29: Branch Department, Series C: Branch Newsletters and Regional Field Office Files, 1966–1971*. These materials come from Group IV of the NAACP Records Collection at the Library of Congress, and, in order to maintain the original order, they were microfilmed by UPA in a different series. Branch newsletters for the period from 1956 to 1965 can be found in UPA's *Papers of the NAACP, Part 25: Branch Department Files, Series C: Branch Newsletters and Printed Materials, 1956–1965*.

The second subseries in this edition consists of annual reports from NAACP branches and state conferences. These reports are also organized by year and in alphabetical order by state. The annual reports generally include summaries of the major accomplishments and campaigns for a particular area. For example, the Ohio State Conference report for 1966 (Reel 4, Frame 0461) covers the annual meeting, fund-raising, employment initiatives, and NAACP political activity in Ohio. The report from Ohio for 1967 (Reel 4, Frame 0711) covers the important decision in *Ethridge v. Rhodes*, a case involving employment discrimination by building contractors and building trades unions working on a \$12.8 million medical science building at Ohio State University. U.S. District Court Judge Joseph Kinneary ruled that the state of Ohio could not enter into contracts with four companies because these companies permitted discriminatory hiring practices. The 1967 Ohio annual report also mentions the 1967 election of Carl B. Stokes as mayor of Cleveland and demonstrations at Central State University. Other detailed annual reports in this subseries cover the Tennessee State Conference; Madison County, Indiana; Boston, Massachusetts; Newark, New Jersey; Corvallis, Oregon; and Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

The third subseries in this edition is Annual Branch Activities Reports. These reports are arranged by year and then in alphabetical order by state. Annual Branch Activities Reports are standard questionnaire forms in which branch leaders were asked to comment on branch initiatives in education, housing, employment, memberships, youth, legal redress, public relations, demonstrations, and political activity. Local leaders were also given space at the end of the report to write about the outstanding accomplishments of their branch for the year. The fact that branch leaders discussed the same issues allows for in-depth study of a particular branch, and it also gives researchers the opportunity for comparative and even qualitative study across branches and regions. There is a great deal of variation in the depth and quality of the Annual Branch Activities Reports, and some branches also attached monthly reports, annual reports, and newspaper clippings. The most detailed reports come from the following branches: Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; Honolulu, Hawaii; New Iberia, Louisiana; Bronx, New York; Glens Falls, New York; East St. Louis, Missouri; Springfield, Massachusetts; Coahoma County, Mississippi;

St. Louis, Missouri; Portland, Oregon; Atlantic City, New Jersey; Broome County, New York; Forrest County, Mississippi; Burlington County, New Jersey; Newark, New Jersey; and Coatesville, Pennsylvania. Annual Branch Activities Reports from the period 1940–1965 can be found in UPA's *Papers of the NAACP, Part 25: Branch Department, Series A: Regional Files and Special Reports, 1941–1955*, and *Series B: Regional Files and Special Reports, 1956–1965*.

The fourth subseries in this edition is General Office Files. The General Office Files are arranged alphabetically by subject. As with the other subseries in this edition, the General Office Files primarily date from 1966 to 1972; however, there are some materials that date from before 1966. Based on the dates of accession, these materials were arranged into one group by the Library of Congress. UPA has microfilmed these materials according to the arrangement by the Library of Congress. The General Office Files begin with a file on police clashes with the Nation of Islam in Los Angeles, California, in 1962, and in Rochester, New York, in 1963. This file shows how the Branch Department responded to incidents such as these that garnered national attention. For example, a February 1963 memorandum by NAACP Branch Director Gloster B. Current to NAACP national staff members notes: "Our problem in Rochester is how to protest police brutality and not appear to be supporting the Muslims [Nation of Islam] or their program per se" (Reel 10, Frames 0557–0558). This file also includes newspaper clippings on the NAACP's role in the Rochester events and a draft letter from Current instructing branches on how to proceed in incidents involving police brutality and the Nation of Islam.

A significant concentration of the General Office Files in this edition pertain to NAACP efforts to become more involved in urban areas and with central city residents. This involvement became particularly important after the outbreak of urban riots in several cities in 1964 and 1965, and then nationwide in 1966. Files from the NAACP Youth and College Division's Community Action Project (Reel 10, Frames 0726–0959) document one way in which the NAACP attempted to get involved with urban residents. Community Action Projects were established in seven cities in order to involve residents in NAACP programs and to help them use available resources to solve community problems. The files contain reports on each of the projects. Two files entitled "Ghetto Leaders" (Reel 11, Frames 0303 and 0492) contain lists of African American leaders in urban areas. The "Ghetto Branch Activities" file (Reel 11, Frame 0281) covers NAACP branches in Oakland, California; Newark, New Jersey; and Memphis, Tennessee. NAACP Housing Department files (Reel 11, Frames 0507–0948) document NAACP efforts to improve housing opportunities and conditions in the nation's cities. The "Inter-Departmental Communications, Program Department" files (Reel 12, Frames 0424–0862, and Reel 13, Frames 0001–0083) pertain to the appointment of urban program directors for large cities. The "Riots" files (Reel 14, Frame 0452–0931) include reports from NAACP field staff and branch leaders on riots in several cities.

The General Office Files also cover other aspects of NAACP activities in the period between 1966 and 1972. The "Inter-Departmental Communications, Legal

Department” files (Reel 12, Frame 0001–0423) include memoranda on cases involving employment discrimination, school desegregation, housing discrimination, police brutality, and discrimination by building trades unions. A file on the NAACP’s Washington Bureau (Reel 13, Frame 0084) includes reports and correspondence on the NAACP’s continuing efforts to promote its civil rights program on a national level. There are also copies of letters from Washington Bureau Director Clarence M. Mitchell Jr. expressing the NAACP’s opposition to the Supreme Court nominations of G. Harrold Carswell and William Rehnquist. Other topics covered in the General Office Files include the assassination of Mississippi NAACP leader Vernon Dahmer; the 1968 strike by Memphis, Tennessee, sanitation workers; and NAACP efforts regarding voter registration.

The final subseries in this edition is Staff files on NAACP Director of Branches and Field Administration Gloster B. Current. These files consist of correspondence written by and received by Current regarding Branch Department activities. Topics covered in these memoranda include the NAACP’s position on the Vietnam War, riot prevention, memberships, 1968 national elections, and demonstrations at Kent State University. The final item in this subseries is a transcript of a speech delivered by Current at a February 1967 meeting in Bronx, New York, entitled “The Civil Rights Revolution and Its Impact on America.” In this speech, Current summarizes some of the key moments in the African American freedom struggle.
