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SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The records in this edition are the central administrative files of NAACP Chief Counsel Robert L. Carter between 1956 and 1965. Carter took over the position of chief counsel in 1957 when Thurgood Marshal was forced by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) to formally separate the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, Inc. (LDEF) from the NAACP. The separation was required in order for the LDEF—or the "Inc. Fund," as it was commonly called—to justify its tax-exempt status. That status permitted donations to the Inc. Fund as tax exemptions for donors, but only on the proviso that the organization refrain entirely from efforts at political influence. Since the NAACP had evolved into a major political pressure organization, leading a powerful coalition in favor of federal civil rights legislation, the close relationship between it and the Inc. Fund jeopardized the latter's standing as a tax-exempt organization. Concerned that hostile critics of the NAACP would force an unfavorable IRS ruling, Marshall resigned as NAACP chief counsel and devoted himself exclusively to the legal redress campaign spearheaded by the Inc. Fund, while Robert L. Carter succeeded Marshall as chief counsel of the NAACP.

Marshall's NAACP Inc. Fund aggressively continued the NAACP's legal redress campaign. The Inc. Fund litigated to speed the implementation of the Supreme Court's desegregation order in Brown v. Board of Education, and it also took up many cases in defense of African Americans' constitutional rights in criminal proceedings and in defense of voting rights. Robert Carter's office, meanwhile, served the corporate needs of the NAACP, adjudicating internal NAACP controversies and defending the organization itself from attacks by hostile state governments in the South. However, the lines of demarcation between Marshall's Inc. Fund and Carter's chief counsel's office were often blurred. This was largely a result of the fact that Carter was responsible for defending local NAACP branch officers who were acting in their official capacity as NAACP officials. Many of these local leaders became embroiled in criminal prosecutions because of their civil rights work in the South. Carter's office, therefore, defended constitutional safeguards against false arrest and malicious prosecutions just as the Inc. Fund did. In addition, many local NAACP branch leaders spearheaded desegregation drives by filing as petitioners in cases. This drew Carter's office into many of the same types of cases that Marshall was litigating on behalf of the Inc. Fund, including school

desegregation and desegregation of public facilities. The case files for this litigation are microfilmed separately as Parts 23 A through 23 C of UPA's *Papers of the NAACP*. Many of the Administrative Files contained in this collection shed light on the chief counsel's civil rights litigation.

In addition to defending the NAACP and its local officers, the chief counsel also consulted with state and national officials about the content of proposed legislation—both potentially favorable or adverse to the cause of civil rights. Federal, state, and local civil rights initiatives were often submitted for his criticism. He was an active and visible presence on behalf of the NAACP, and therefore he was much in demand as a speaker and conference participant. Finally, the chief counsel advised both the national office and the branches on questions of structure and adjudicated questions arising under the NAACP constitution and bylaws.

The files microfilmed for this edition contain a mix of Robert Carter's administrative and subject reference files. The reference files were useful in all of his duties, including litigation and advice on the association's operation. Some seem to have stemmed from Carter's political or intellectual interest in a subject. Many detail the wide scope of his involvement in American legal culture and politics in the late 1950s and early 1960s. Correspondence and administrative files document the daily routine of the NAACP chief counsel's responsibilities. Many letters touch on points of relevance to litigation. Following are brief descriptions of the major subseries in the edition.

General Correspondence

There are nine archive boxes of General Correspondence. Seven boxes are correspondence of Robert L. Carter, and two boxes are correspondence of his chief assistant counsel, Maria Marcus. There are also a few folders of correspondence of assistant counsels Barbara Morris, Constance Baker Motley, and Lewis M. Steel. And there is a single folder of correspondence of Thurgood Marshall for 1956 (the last year before Marshall and the LDEF separated from the NAACP). The correspondence is arranged between incoming and outgoing. It is thereunder arranged alphabetically by last name of correspondent. In spite of the division between incoming and outgoing, both series include incoming correspondence with attached outgoing replies.

The correspondence touches on a wide range of matters, including communications with local attorneys regarding litigation, requests for Carter or other NAACP attorneys as public speakers, requests for copies of briefs and other legal documents by friendly organizations, and discussions of pending legislation. It includes correspondence with other political organizations, such as the American Jewish Congress, and background checks on whether local attorneys can be trusted in civil rights litigation. A large amount of the correspondence in this series is in the form of complaints from local NAACP officials about denials of rights and pleas to Carter for legal

aid or advice. A large number of the complaints allege employment or housing discrimination. This material constitutes a vivid record of conditions faced by civil rights proponents in the late 1950s and early 1960s. In addition, there is correspondence between Carter and other national NAACP leaders. Of particular value is the correspondence between Carter and Clarence Mitchell of the NAACP Washington Bureau on pending federal civil rights legislation. There are also many references to pending litigation such as the Jackson, Mississippi, demonstration cases and the various attempts by southern states to drive the NAACP out of business. There are also many letters concerning NAACP desegregation cases. Many of these cases are further documented by the Legal Department's case files, to be found in Part 23 A through 23 C.

Memoranda File

This small series spans a single archive box. Many of these memoranda discuss the civil rights cases the NAACP was litigating, such as the *Gomillion v. Lightfoot* voting rights case. However, there are also memoranda on problems with volunteer attorneys in civil rights litigation (1956), NAACP branch field work (1957), disbarment proceedings against NAACP attorneys in Virginia by hostile state officials (1960), reprisals against other NAACP leaders such as W. W. Law and Rev. Theodore R. Gibson (1961), proposed amendments to the 1957 Federal Civil Rights Act (1960), and the desegregation of schools outside of the South (1962). In addition, there are memoranda on NAACP workshops and strategy conferences between 1956 and 1965.

General Administrative File

This twenty-box series is the largest component of this edition. It includes Subject Files, records of Carter's adjudication of NAACP branch disputes, and general NAACP administrative materials, including reports of the general counsel's office. The Subject Files range widely, from topics in which Carter took a personal interest—such as Africa, American Negro Leadership Conference on Africa, and American Society for African Culture—to major initiatives of the NAACP, such as housing policies, employment discrimination, police brutality, school desegregation, soldiers' complaints about discrimination in the military, and voting rights. NAACP administrative files include files on the Board of Directors, Case Summaries (which include synopses of civil rights cases between 1915 and the early 1960s), Conference on DeFacto School Segregation, Fighting Fund for Freedom, Lawyers' Conferences, NAACP, Reports, Structure, roles and salary scale of the national legal staff, and the files on individual NAACP leaders, including Carter, Moon, and Wilkins. There are numerous files pertaining to the events in the South during this period, including Arkansas, Louisiana statutes,

Mississippi civil rights cases, Mississippi statutes, Recent Persecution of NAACP in the South, Tuskegee Civic Association, Victims of White Supremacy, and appropriate sections of the files on major NAACP areas of interest noted above (i.e., Housing, Labor, Police Brutality, School Desegregation, and Voting Rights).

The subseries on the NAACP branches includes information on internal disputes as well as general communications from branches (typically reporting civil rights complaints) in the series titled Branches. The Branch Disputes series includes controversies over branch elections and over the removal of branch officers for cause. The cases usually include an opinion by Robert Carter. The Branch Matters series includes discussion of a management consultant's report on model branch organization as well as communications from Gloster B. Current, the national director of branches. These communications touch upon a wide range of matters affecting local branches, including reprisals against local branch leaders (including the murder of Medgar Evers in Mississippi), the Mississippi Summer Program, and relations with other civil rights organizations such as the Southern Christian Leadership Conference.

The largest subseries among the branch materials is simply titled Branches, and it includes an arrangement by state. These files include numerous civil rights complaints made to Carter by branch leaders, including housing and voting discrimination, reprisals against NAACP branches in the South, school desegregation, and criminal cases. In most of these cases Carter either refers the complainant to the NAACP Inc. Fund or suggests that the branch resort to local political pressure before engaging in legal action.

A subject file series on Civil Rights Bills merits special mention. In this series, Carter exchanges memoranda with other NAACP leaders on federal and state civil rights legislation in the 1950s. The state legislation includes the antidiscrimination clause in the Constitution for the new state of Alaska as well as fair housing, fair employment, and civil rights bills for other states. Federal legislation focuses on a proposed 1958 Civil Rights Act. The internal memos discuss the philosophy of resorting to federal legislation rather than voluntarism to achieve the goals of an integrated society.

A final series worth special mention is the Civilian Review Board. Civilian review boards (CRBs) were established in several American cities in the wake of widespread race riots in the mid-1960s. The bulk of the documentation concerns New York City's Civilian Review Board, but there are background files on legal challenges to the constitutionality of CRBs in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and Rochester, New York.
