- In the **Enter Names** section, enter one or more party names.
- In the **Advanced Keyword Complaint Notification** section, enter one or more keywords.
- Click on the red **Next** button.
- Select Natures of Suit and click the red **Next** button.
- Complete the setup process and save your new Alert.

**To access Keyword Alert Results within CourtLink:**

- Select the **Alert** tab from the top navigation menu.
- View the **Alert Results** tab for a complete listing of results; select an **Alert Type**.
- Keyword Alert results are indicated in the **Complaint** column.
