


Make the most of your time by downloading the <u>Lexis</u> <u>Legal News Briefs</u> mobile app **no charge!** This Apple® iPhone® and Apple iPad® mobile app¹ helps you stay on top of the latest legal news. Once downloaded, this app gives you updates with "no-matter-where" convenience and ready access to legal news from some of the nation's premium publications. There's no need to wait to check on topics of interest when you have the updates at hand with your handheld mobile device.

#### Delivering legal news as you like it ...

The Lexis Legal News Briefs app is **designed to display only the sources that are part of your** *lexis.com*<sup>®</sup> **news subscription**—up to seven major legal, financial, political and news publications.<sup>2</sup>

- Miami Herald
- The National Law Journal®
- The New York Times®
- The Washington Post®
- The Wall Street Journal®



When you select a publication name, the app runs a predetermined search at *lexis.com* within that publication and returns legal news from that day's edition of the publication. No search entry needed.

The searches use LexisNexis SmartIndexing Technology™ terms to identify articles on legal practice areas, law firm news, compliance/regulatory news, statutory news, judicial news and executive orders.

The exception is *The National Law Journal*. When you select this publication, the app delivers the "Voir Dire" and "In Brief" columns.

Not only can you have the most recent news, but you can also share it with clients and colleagues by **emailing full-text articles**<sup>2</sup> that keep everyone involved on the same page—literally and figuratively.



The Lexis Legal News Briefs app also lets you filter the news you receive by three practice areas:

- Mergers and Acquisitions
- Securities
- Intellectual Property

Here's how. Under the **Practice Areas** tab, select a practice area, and LexisNexis SmartIndexing Technology term searches look across the combined publications to identify articles related to the specific area of law. For instance, Mergers and Acquisitions looks for articles on topics such as acquisitions, mergers, joint ventures, takeovers, tender offers, divestitures and buyouts.

## Part of your lexis.com subscription—and invoice

Each refresh of the content is reflected as a search in your subscription usage, and search charges incurred while you're using the Lexis Legal News Briefs app is part of your *lexis.com* subscription. These charges will be reflected in your monthly *lexis.com* invoice. And, to assist with billing, the app provides the **option of entering a Client ID at the log in page** so you can track research costs by client to maintain accurate billing records.

## Download—without charge—from the Apple® iTunes® Store

Get the news you want when you need it ... as soon as possible. Lexis Legal News Briefs is available as a free app at the <u>iTunes Store</u>, and can be easily downloaded to your mobile device<sup>1</sup>.

Once at the iTunes Store:

- 1. Search for LexisNexis®.
- 2. Click the "Free App" bar under app description to begin downloading.
- 3. When prompted, insert iTunes username and password to complete the download.
- 4. Sync iPhone or iPad device.
