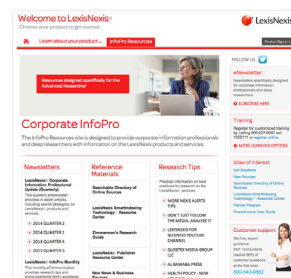

## Update on changes coming to the Nexis® service interface

A new, refreshed *nexis.com*® interface is still on schedule to debut by the end of 2014. In the last issue of [LexisNexis® Corporate information Professional Update](#), we gave you an overview of what you could expect. Now here is your first look—and a few more details.

### Going global

A new global sign-in page will let you choose your language. Even select U.S. English or UK English. Plus find a new link to take you to details on new Nexis® service enhancements.

### New and refined search options

When the new interface premieres, you'll notice immediately that the *My Nexis*™ tab will display the Power Search form as the default. (Easy Search is still right there.) Plus you'll have more convenient access to other LexisNexis subscription products, and the options such as the local help/support number for your country will be easier to find and use.

You'll also notice search forms across Nexis will be more consistent and even easier to use. For example, select custom search dates from a calendar. (See above.) Plus you'll find it easier to find the sources and search terms you need. Enter a partial source title in the Power Search and News search forms, and a source word wheel provides title suggestions. Click and go. The same option is available for index-term selection in Power Search and News forms. Enter a partial term and get matching term suggestions.

The Company search form will be redesigned so you can more easily select from all available sources, organized by geography.

## Enhanced delivery options

Count on a total redesign of the Nexis delivery folder, with new sorting options so you can organize documents in order of publication date with just one click. Plus you'll be able to hold up to 500 documents. And when you do select documents for print, the delivery options screens have been re-formatted so you can select options and deliver more quickly.

## New results page options

Here's something you'll like. The results page you see now will still be available as the default. But you can click the link at the top of the screen and go to the newly designed results page with more options to help you zero in on relevant documents—like tabs that filter results to specific content types like Blogs. Plus you can use a new preview option for full-text news sources that will display the full text without closing the results list. (For other content types, the first 500 words will display.) It will be great for comparing articles quickly to find just the right one.

The results display itself will be formatted in columns that clearly display the source, date, length of article and more.

Print, email, download—or send it to the cloud!

Now when you review your *nexis.com*® results, you can deposit full-text documents directly to **Google Drive™** or **Dropbox®**. It's as simple as requesting print or download delivery. **The new Download to Cloud icon displays in the results view, delivery folder and full-text document view.**

## Here's how to download to the cloud:

Enter your search words and review your results. As you browse the full-text documents and results list, you can select documents for delivery. Just click the checkbox next to the document title.

Select the **Download to Cloud** icon (Circled at right).

Your **Send to Cloud** delivery options screen displays. You can select to download to Dropbox or Google Drive. Also select formatting options, including font. Or save in HTML, as a PDF or in Microsoft® Word.
