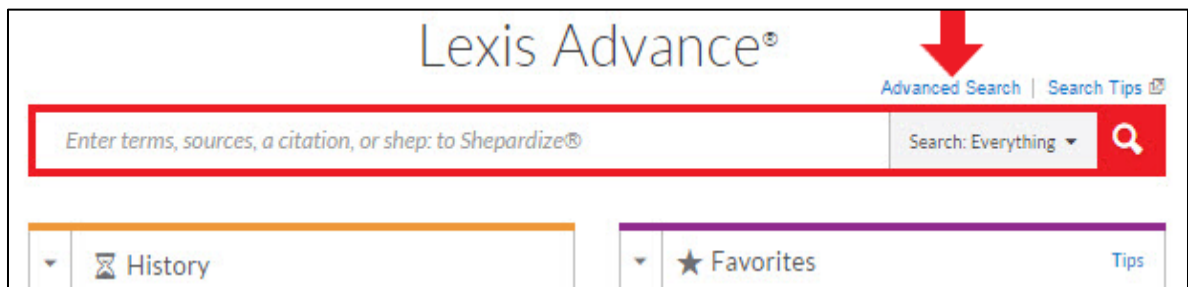


Advanced Search enhancements on Lexis Advance®
