Research Congressional documents at Lexis Advance—back to 1789. The ultimate collection of historical Congressional research materials is now available through Lexis Advance as well as *lexis.com*[®]. While the U.S. Serial Set and archived *Congressional Record* sources are not frequently requested sources, they can be vital for legislative researchers.

U.S. Serial Set

The U.S. Serial Set at Lexis Advance—called **Congressional Documents 1789 – present (U.S. Serial Set)**—is the digital collection, which includes searchable full-text PDFs of all House and Senate documents and reports, including legislative and investigative reports, and Senate Executive Documents from 1818 – 1978.

Research more than 347,000 titles and 9.7 million pages produced from 1789 – 1978 in the U.S. Serial Set, including:

- Congressional journals, administrative reports, directories, manuals and related internal publications
- Congressional reports on public and private legislation considered during each Congress
- Reports resulting from congressionally commissioned or conducted investigations
- Annually submitted reports from federal executive agencies, reviewing current problems and activities under agency purview
- Extended series of survey, research and statistical publications developed by executive agencies
- Selected annual or special reports of nongovernmental agencies
- · American State Papers, 1789 1838
- House executive documents, 1847 1895
- House miscellaneous documents, 1847 1895
- Nongovernmental organization reports
- Senate executive documents, 1847 1895
- Senate miscellaneous documents, 1847 1895

The Serial Set also includes PDFs of more than 55,000 historic government maps.

Searching legislative history documents at Lexis Advance

While available as PDFs, the legislative history sources just added to Lexis Advance can be searched due to controlled vocabulary subject indexing, bill and publication number indexing and extensive bibliographic information.

Full-text PDFs can be emailed or downloaded without losing their full functionality. For some legislative history sources, you have the option to download large documents as one PDF and as 50-page "chunks." Plus the PDFs are optimized to compress the content into packages.
