The U.S. Serial Set is a vast collection of United States government publications published in “serial” fashion under the directive of Congress. This set is comprised of all Congressional reports and documents, as well as executive agency and departmental reports ordered to be printed by Congress, including:

Congressional Publications

- committee reports
- House and Senate journals
- rules manuals
- numerous investigations, directories, and histories of Congress and the Capitol

Executive Branch Publications

- messages from the President of the United States
- annual administrative reports of departments and agencies
- series publications, e.g., Geological Survey Bulletin
- periodicals, e.g., Monthly Summary of Foreign Commerce
- Department of Commerce and predecessor Department of Commerce and Labor reports on foreign commerce
- Department of State commercial relations, commercial policy, and foreign relations series
- Smithsonian Institution’s Bureau of Ethnology reports and bulletins
- Bureau of Labor and the Bureau of Labor Statistics bulletins
- Census Bureau Statistical Abstracts

Miscellaneous Publications

Other important collections within the set defy classification by origin. These include a number of volumes containing unusual historical data, as well as: hearings; reports; exhibits of congressional and executive branch commissions; and investigations and inquiries such as studies of wages and prices, immigration, woman and child labor, unemployment, national security, conduct of war, and civil rights.

What your search results offer

The results of your search provide a wealth of information that, depending on the type of search performed, can include:

- Metadata (bibliographic data) only
- Links to the PDF document image
- Links to an entire PDF for larger documents, as well as smaller increments to facilitate downloading
- A split screen (Adobe Acrobat 6.0 and higher) shows all instances of the term searched within the documents. Alternatively, you can use the Adobe “Find” feature (the binocular icon) to locate a specific term.
- Bookmarks aid navigation by direct click to a desired graphic in a document that includes illustrations or maps

There are three main search forms to utilize for Serial Set material: Basic, Advanced, and Search By Number.

Basic

The Basic Search form:

- returns targeted results by searching abstracts, indexing, and bibliographic data;
- restricts by date or a Congressional session;
- offers simple interface; and
- links to the Advanced Search form.

To add Index Terms to your search:

1. **Select a type** from the drop-down menu. Your available menu options are based on how you choose to restrict your search. Choose from subject terms, geographical terms or issuing sources.
2. **Find a term or browse for terms** and check the boxes for the terms you want to add.
3. **Click OK – Paste to search** to include the terms in your Basic form.
4. Terms inserted in the form display with quote marks and the OR connector is placed between terms.
5. **Click Search** to submit your search.

Advanced

The Advanced Search form, in addition to the steps on the Basic Search form, offers you expanded capabilities and requires only one search to:

- search the documents in full text;
- restrict your search exclusively to Serial Set Maps (from Index Terms, optional);
- find Serial Set documents by the author's name;
- retrieve maps that are indexed to subject terms as opposed to those that just mention a term in passing; and
- search by document type, e.g., Annual Report.

Search By Number

The Search By Number form is designed more for those who want to:

- find a specific document and search by publication number, SuDoc, or CIS accession number; or
- find a specific legislative history by enacted bill number, Public Law number, or Statutes at Large citation; or
- browse for publications that reference a specific bill or are associated with a specific Public Law.
