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Almost all foreign medical graduates in J-1 status are subject to a requirement that they return to their home country at the completion of the training program for two years. Satisfaction or waiver of this requirement is necessary before moving from J visa status to most any other visa status. Therefore, in most cases a return to the home country for two years or a waiver of this requirement is necessary before a foreign doctor can obtain employment in the United States. See our <u>Foreign Medical Graduate Fact Sheet</u> and <u>J-1 Waiver Update for Foreign Medical Graduates</u>.

J-1 waivers are sometimes available to foreign medical graduates who have an employment offer that is important to a state department of health, usually if the doctor is working in primary care in a medically underserved area in the state. This waiver option is called the State 30 Program, because it is limited to 30 foreign medical graduate waivers per state per year.

The following is a chart our law firm has compiled summarizing which states will sponsor foreign medical graduates for J-1 waivers, and under what conditions. Not all states participate in this program. We caution that states change their policies all the time and without warning. The following list is as current as the information provided by each state's web site so it is best to check with us for the latest information.

A list of abbreviations is at the end of this document.

Notable Requirements: Will grant a waiver only if FMG attempted to use all other IGA waiver programs first; facility must have recruited at state medical schools; hospitals listed in the current Alabama State Rural Health Plan, and other Alabama employers located in non Metropolitan Statistical Areas, to submit sub-specialist applications beginning on the first work day of October each year, starting October 1, 2004. Other Alabama sub-specialist employers may submit applications beginning on the first Monday of the first full work week during the following January, through either the following September 30 or until all sub-specialist allocations have been used for that program year, whichever comes first. Any sub-specialty applications received after depletion of available sub-specialty allocations will be returned without action. Presently a maximum of 15 sub-specialty applications have been allocated per program year (October-September). No more than two (2) sub-specialty applications may be submitted for the same employer; contracts may not contain a restrictive non-compete clause which

prevents or discourages the physician from continuing to practice in area after the period of J-1 waiver service obligation has expired.
