LANDING PAGE

When you click on the logo it will take you back to the home page.

The **search box** allows you to run a search without having to select a specific source. This improves your ease of use and reduces training time.

Pre-search filters allow you to filter answer sets according to content, jurisdiction, and/or practice area or topic, dramatically improving your search time and results.

My Workspace carousel welcomes you to Lexis Advance™ and directs you to some quick links. This is a great resource to use to navigate quickly around the product.



Global navigation appears on every page so you can easily navigate the site and get to where you want to go quickly.

Search Options gives you the ability to run a specific search of your choice.

Click the **Shepard's®** tab and it automatically populates the search box with **shep:**. Enter your citation and click to retrieve your **Shepard's®** report.

Lexis Advance requires Internet Explorer® 8, Firefox® 3.5 or Google Chrome™ 7.x browsers for optimum performance.


RESULTS PAGE

The anchor tab shows you the initial search characters you used to run your search and remains there until you run a new search. This allows you to return to your original results quickly.

RESEARCH MAP

With Research Map you get a step-by-step graphical depiction of your prior research history so you can quickly pick up where you left off. Research Map assists you in seeing the bigger picture by identifying explored vs. non-explored paths allowing you to uncover new results that may have been missed, but are still relevant to your case.
