Publishing Changes Commencing 1 December 2025

As part of our ongoing efforts to streamline content delivery and enhance efficiency, we're making important changes to the way we update and publish regulatory compliance content.

Final Monthly Publishing Cycle: November

November (17–18th window) will mark the final day for publishing content updates under the current monthly publishing cycle.

From December, we will move to a more flexible and responsive publishing model.

Introducing the Progressive Content Delivery Model

Starting 1 December 2025, updates to our obligation content will be made progressively as and when required, rather than on a set monthly schedule.

This shift means that critical changes and improvements are reflected in our content with greater alignment to regulatory timelines, helping our customers stay ahead and respond faster.

GRC partners should perform daily data refreshes where possible to capture ongoing obligation updates in a timely manner.

Monthly News Alerts – Streamlined and More Usable

Although we are moving to a continuous delivery model, we will still send monthly news alerts. These will be sent in the first week of each month, summarising noteworthy changes made during the previous month.


We're also simplifying the format to improve readability and customer experience:

- Obligation titles will be included to assist with searching and navigation

NEW MODULES

Australia

In this edition, we're excited to unveil upcoming modules designed to bolster compliance across key sectors, including our new Queensland Mining and NSW Local Government modules launching in November.

We're also preparing for future archiving adjustments within our Aged Care framework to ensure our offerings remain current and fully aligned with regulatory changes.

Coming in November: Queensland Mining

The Queensland Mining module provides mining organisations with information on how to comply with legal responsibilities relating to obtaining licences and leases, land access, WHS, mine inspections and transportation of mined resources as well as financial reporting and foreign investment. It also covers the requirements for mining licences and leases, including Aboriginal heritage, native title, environmental protections and water monitoring. Whether the organisation has surface or underground operations, or has onshore or offshore functions, the Queensland Mining module provides support for its effective compliance management.

Coming in November: NSW Local Government

NSW Local Government is comprised of seven submodules addressing the specific requirements of council responsibility: governance, administration and integrity; finance; roads and infrastructure; land use, planning and development; public lands and property; public health and other community services; and water, waste and environment. Its coverage forms a comprehensive compliance framework for local and county councils; mayors, councillors and general managers; senior governance, finance, planning and environmental officers, as well as compliance and risk managers responsible for council service delivery and regulatory functions.

FUTURE ARCHIVING

Aged Care – Australia

The recently released **Aged Care – Registered Aged Care Providers** submodule covers the requirements under the Aged Care Act 2024 (Cth) that commenced on 1 November.

The new framework replaces that covered in the existing **Aged Care – Home Care and Aged Care – Residential Care**. As a result, these two submodules will no longer be updated or alerted on from 1 November (although due to transitional arrangements, they will remain available for customers who may have existing activities in progress under the old system). At a future date that will be communicated, those modules will be archived.

Please note that the submodule **Aged Care – Retirement Villages**, which covers state-based regulation of retirement villages, is not impacted and continues to be part of the module.
