New Modules

Australia

Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG)

The Australia ESG module provides organisations with a comprehensive guide to navigating both mandatory and voluntary sustainability regimes, including the National Greenhouse and Energy Reporting Scheme and key standards from the AASB and ASX. It helps companies meet their legal responsibilities for sustainability reporting and enhances transparency, whilst highlighting opportunities to improve long-term sustainability, stakeholder relationships, and overall environmental impact.

Payment Times Reporting

The Payment Times Reporting module is designed to guide entities through the intricacies of the Payment Times Reporting Scheme by outlining the classification criteria to determine reporting obligations, the specific payment practices that must be disclosed, and the technical requirements for submissions. In addition to clarifying recordkeeping, compliance audits, and regulatory investigations, the module ensures entities understand how to challenge reviewable decisions and maintain proper documentation of their payment behaviours.

Insurance Contracts and Operations

This module provides insurers - both general insurers and life companies - with essential guidance on complying with the Insurance Contracts Act 1984 and related regulations, covering everything from the administrative aspects and disclosure obligations of insurance contracts to claims handling, privacy, and recordkeeping. With a firm focus on ensuring consumer protection and meeting prudential requirements related to risk management, recovery, and exit planning, the module serves as a detailed compliance roadmap for managing day-to-day insurance operations.

Registered Aged Care Providers (Launching June 2025)

Building on the reforms introduced by the new Aged Care Act 2024 (Cth), this module equips registered providers with a practical compliance guide to the evolving regulatory framework for funded aged care services, encompassing obligations under the Aged Care Rules 2025 and Financial and Prudential Standards. It focuses on strengthening consumer rights, enhancing governance, ensuring financial transparency and operational resilience, and supporting quality care delivery, thus helping providers avoid regulatory penalties while upholding high standards of service.

United Kingdom

Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG)

The UK ESG module offers organisations practical assistance to meet a broad range of mandatory and voluntary ESG regulatory regimes, from the Emissions Trading Scheme and the Energy Savings Opportunity Scheme to the Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive and the UK Corporate Governance Code. By focusing on environmental impact, social responsibility, and robust governance practices, this module ensures that companies are not only compliant with existing regulations but are also prepared to proactively disclose and manage climate-related risks and opportunities.

Building Societies and Credit Unions (Launching June 2025)

Designed specifically for building societies and credit unions, this new module covers licensing, governance, and risk management processes tailored to the regulatory landscape for these institutions. Alongside detailed explanations of authorisation requirements, internal controls, and regulatory obligations derived from the FCA, PRA, and FSMA 2000, the module emphasises financial crime controls, data protection, business continuity, and consumer protection to help these organisations maintain robust operations in a complex financial environment.

European Union

Artificial Intelligence Systems

The Artificial Intelligence Systems module is a targeted resource for organisations involved in the development, deployment, or use of AI systems within the EU, helping them navigate the comprehensive regulatory landscape defined by the Artificial Intelligence Act 2024 and additional legislative requirements such as the GDPR and Cybersecurity Act. Digital Operational Resilience

Focused on securing the ICT systems vital to EU financial stability, the Digital Operational Resilience module outlines the obligations set forth by DORA, which comes into effect to mitigate ICT-related disruptions and cyber threats. Covering a wide spectrum of players from banks and payment institutions to crypto asset service providers and central market infrastructures, the module details requirements for risk management, incident reporting, third-party oversight, and operational testing to enhance the overall resilience of financial operations.

Payments (Attestation)

The EU Payments (Attestation) module delivers a detailed overview of the payment systems landscape across the 27 EU member states, providing Payment Service Providers with clarity on the interplay between national legislation and overarching EU directives including PSD2, SEPA, and DORA. With a framework that allows PSPs to assess the adequacy of their existing compliance measures and prepare for market entry, the module is an essential resource for ensuring that all aspects of payment reporting and regulatory inspections meet the necessary baseline standards.

Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG)

The European Union's ESG module serves as a practical guide to navigating the complex and evolving ESG regulatory framework aimed at fostering a sustainable and transparent economy. It addresses the mandatory obligations imposed under instruments such as the EU Taxonomy Regulation, SFDR, CSRD, and the Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive, among others, while also catering to voluntary best practices. The module provides organisations with clear guidelines to align their operations with investor expectations, address environmental and social risks, and meet stringent sustainability reporting requirements across the EU.
