

General Search

Red Box – Conducting a topic search

Conduct a search of topic

A. Type the search terms in the red box. Users have the option to use terms & connectors (Booleans like “and”, “or”, “w/p” etc.) or the natural language processing (type problem statement or just keywords).


B. Choose the jurisdiction by changing the flag based on your preference.

Note: You can still search results from different jurisdiction. The flag you have chosen will be shown in your first result page.

C. Click on the search everything dropdown to narrow down your search (by content type, by topic etc.)

Note: the dropdown option will may differ based on jurisdiction chosen

D. Press “Enter” or Click on Search


General Search

Red Box – Search Map

A. Keywords will appear at the top of the list with assigned color

B. Refer to the search map bar, the color assigned for the keywords will be tagged when the keywords are present in the document. Click on the color tag to view the relevant excerpt from the document.

e.g. to see hits from “breach of trust”, click on the orange bar in the search map.



General Search

Red Box – Filtration tool

- A. User can select jurisdiction by changing the flag.
 - B. User can change between results from different content type (cases, legislation or secondary materials).
 - C. Enter more keywords to search across the result list.
 - D. User can narrow down cases based on courts on which the result originated from.
- Note: user can use "select multiple" to choose more than one court. E.g. narrowing down case only from appellate courts (Court of Appeal & Federal Court)
- E. In the Timeline filter, users can filter the period of cases that they want to see by clicking on the date and year.
 - F. In publications filters, users can choose to only view results from specific publication by clicking on the title.


Advanced Search

To conduct specific searches other than via keyword e.g by reference to specific legislative provision,

- A. From the homepage, click on Advanced Search to trigger the drop-down menu and select content type
- B. Beside reference to legislation, user can also search case by Judges' name, counsel (firm or lawyer's name) & catchword.

Note: Advanced search also available for other content type (e.g. Secondary Materials).

- C. Click Search



Case Search

By case name or citation

E.g. to locate the case "Tan Ying Hong v Tan Sian San & Ors [2010] 2 MLJ 1"

- A. Type in the case name or citation, choose the dropdown of the relevant case and press enter.
- B. Choose any of the citation hyperlink to view the full judgment.
- C. User have options to turn off highlight.
- D. For recommendation of cases that discuss similar principles, user can select from the "Recommended Case" pod in the right hand side.
- E. When PDF "Download Document" is available user can click on the download link on the right-hand side.
- F. If the court ready version is not available, User can still download the document via the normal download method.
- G. Select Formatting Options
- H. Tick the LexisNexis logo box & page numbering before clicking download






Case Search

Case Analysis feature allow user to get more information on any given case. E.g. For “Tan Ying Hong v Tan Sian San & Ors [2010] 2 MLJ 1,

- A. From the case page, click on the “Case Analysis” link
- B. It will open case analysis page that consist of case digest/summary, list of subsequent cases that cite Tan Ying Hong & cases that Tan Ying Hong cited.
- C. Cases that have cited Tan Ying Hong are presented in treatment table and “Case referring to this case list

Head: allowing the appeal with costs here and below. (1) per Zaki Azmi Chief Justice Malaysia and Arisn Zakaria CJ (Halawa); (2) per Zaki Azmi, Arisn Zakaria CJ (Halawa), Justice Alauddin and Justice James Poong PCA. The court held that the appellant had acquired its title to the land through or under a forged instrument, subject to the exceptions set out in s 340(2) and (3). According to the Adorne Properties case, Adorne Properties, the appellant had insulated itself from impeachment by the proviso in s 340(3) of the NLC. The question which arose was whether the proviso immediately after s 340(3) applied to other provisions of s 340, in particular, to s 340(2)(b). This could only be deduced from the proviso itself. The court held that the proviso did not apply to s 340(2)(b). The proviso only applies to the forged charge and not to the other provisions of s 340. The proviso only applies to the forged charge and not to the earlier subsection. This is supported by the use of the words ‘inspite’ in this subsection (b) in the proviso. Therefore its application



E.g. Locate section 101 of the Evidence Act.

- A. In the Quick Find pod, Click on Legislation and type “Evidence Act” in the legislation title and type Section ‘101’ in the provision number box.
 - B. Choose “Unannotated Legislation” and click the search icon.
- Note: Annotated Legislation is available for users who subscribe to Annotated Statutes of Malaysia.*
- C. Click on the result link.
 - D. User can also click “Find Related Cases & Commentary” on the right-hand side tab.



CaseAnalysis uses signals to indicate what kind of treatment a case has received and whether it can be relied on as good law. The table below explains the meaning of these signals.

Not every case has a CaseAnalysis Signal.

Signal	Summary	Explanation
	Negative treatment	Warning – Negative treatment indicated. A negative (red) signal is given to decisions which have been subsequently reversed, disapproved or overruled.
	Cautionary treatment	Caution – Questioning or distinguishing treatment indicated. This indicates that the decision has had some doubt cast on it.
	Positive treatment	Positive treatment indicated. A positive (green) signal is given to decisions which have been subsequently affirmed, applied, etc.
	Neutral treatment	Neutral or citing treatment indicated. The decision has received neutral or ambivalent treatment: considered, explained, etc.
	Citation information	This indicates that no treatment has been given--only citation information is available.
