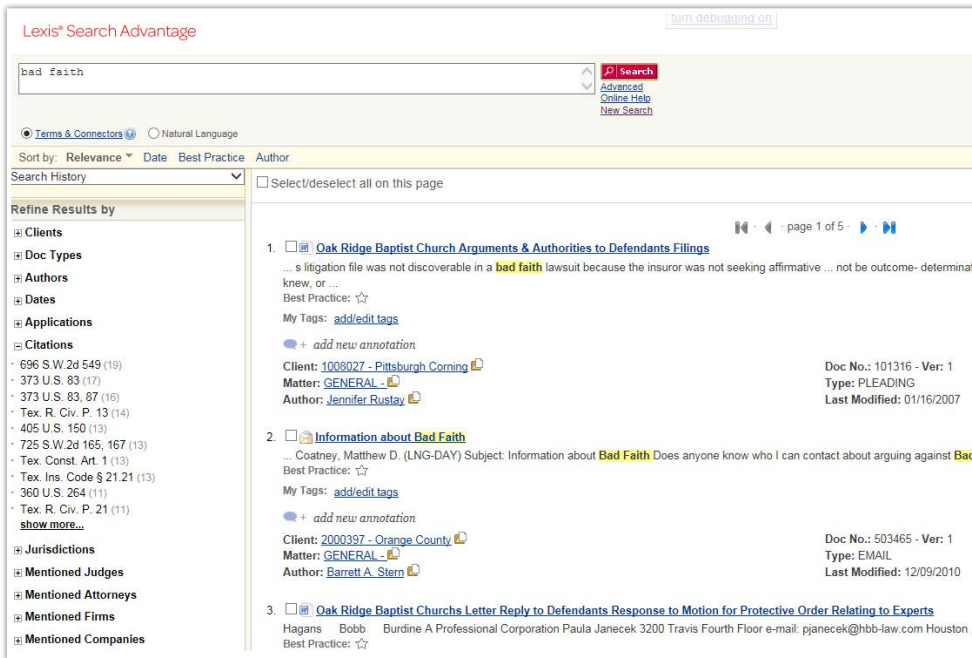
New features for transactional document search now available
