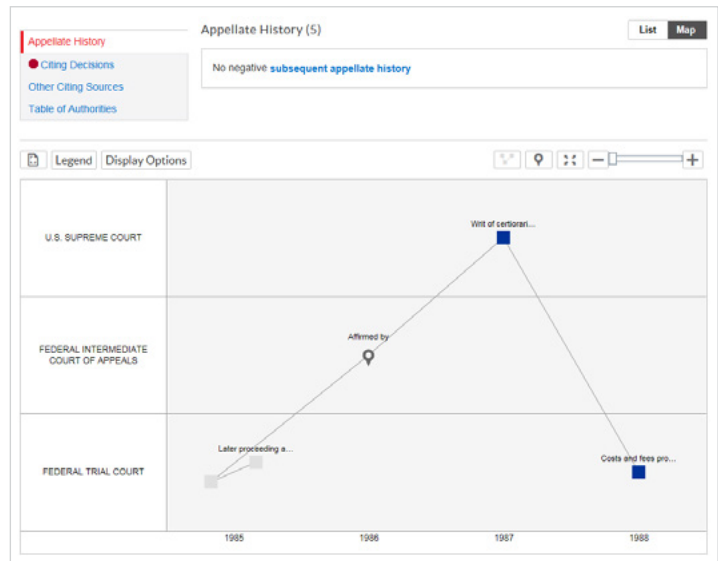

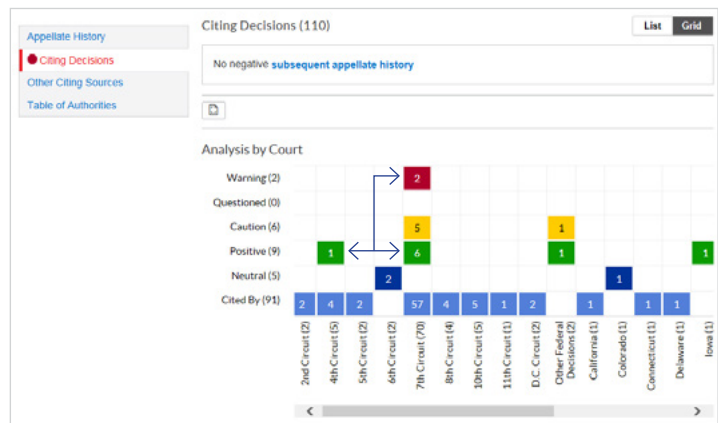
Shepard's Graphical, a Lexis Advance® exclusive, enables you to see the history of citing decisions in an easy visual map or grid format.
