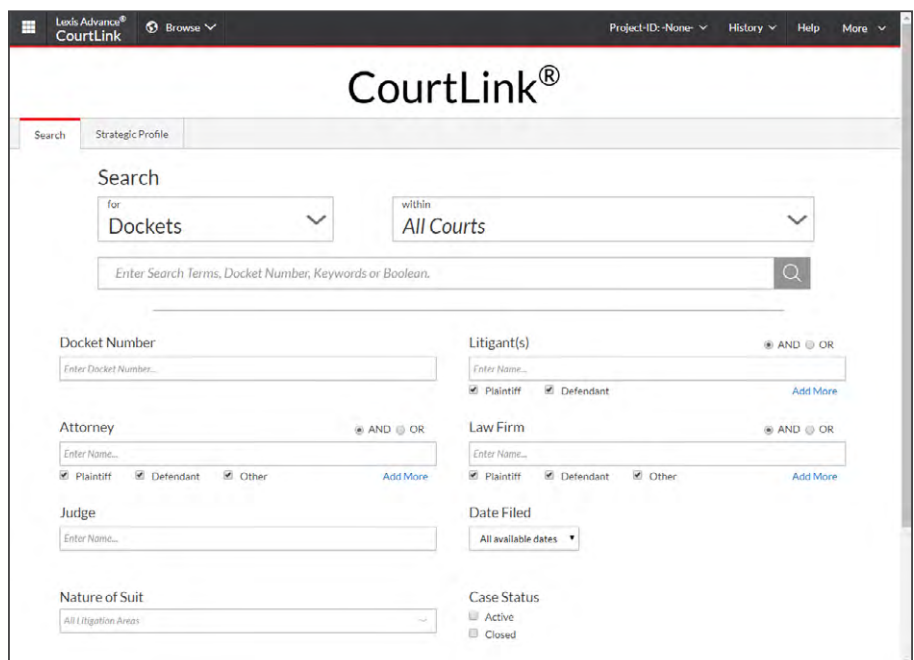

1 Searching dockets with Lexis Advance CourtLink

Enter your search criteria on one screen, rather than entering information on many different screens.

Select search type, courts, natures of suit, etc., and enter search criteria (such as judge, attorney or business name) from one screen. (List navigations can still be used but are not required.)

Search: Refine/filter your search results

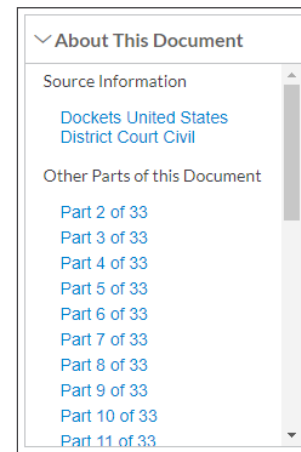

For example, add dockets to folders, or print, email, or save them to Google Drive™, all from the toolbar as your subscription allows. **And save dockets to your desktop, using the Download option.**



Advantages for managing large docket documents: Lexis Advance CourtLink can display dockets of any size, including lengthy class-action litigation dockets. Large docket documents are displayed in parts. Move among the parts using the links in the About This Document box on the right side of the full-text document.



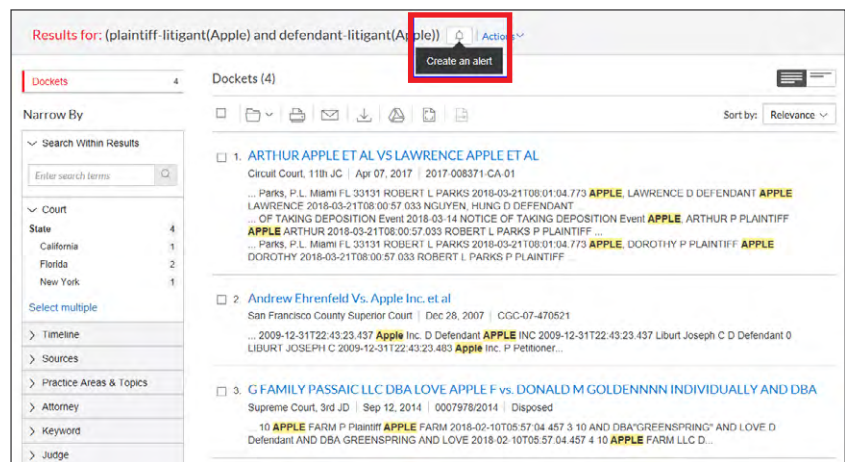
2 Alerts set-up and management with Lexis Advance CourtLink

Your current CourtLink Alerts will be moved automatically as part of your upgrade so you'll be ready to research. Set up alerts in a fraction of the time! Set up on the main **CourtLink search screen on Lexis Advance** and confirm on a second screen, instead of seven distinct steps you needed previously on the CourtLink service. You can also create:

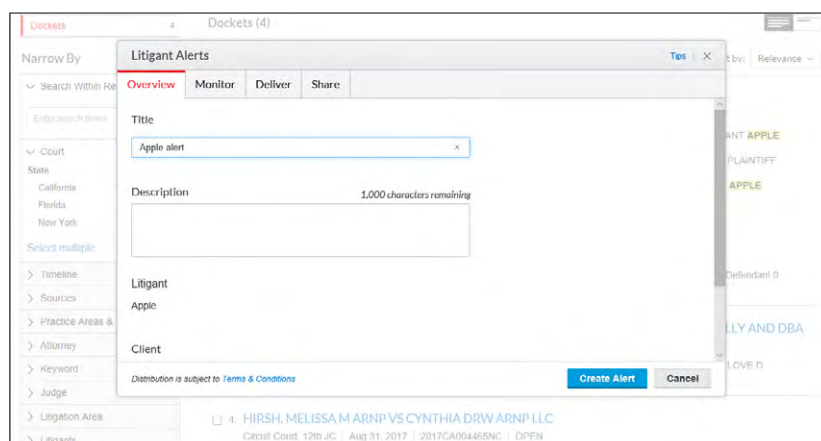
- *Defendant-only* Alerts, where your litigant appears only as a defendant, not as a plaintiff
- Alerts with multiple litigants (e.g., both Apple® and Samsung® display in the case)
- Alerts with pinpoint accuracy, combining litigants, attorneys or law firms, judges, natures of suit and more

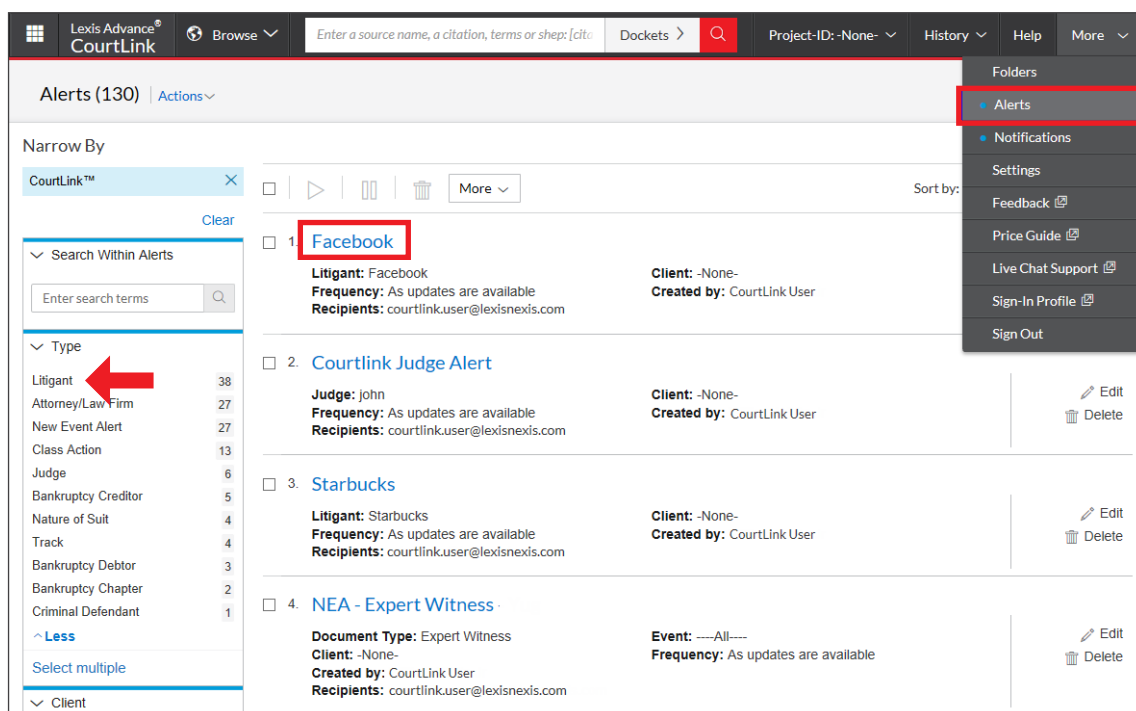


Alerts Set-up: One uniform set-up page
